Hello,

I'm Destin Hoffman. I'm a high school senior at Lindbergh High School in Renton, WA, and I'm also a running start student at Bellevue College taking American Government with Professor Cawthon.

I most recently watched the November 8th regular council meeting and had some questions and comments on how the city of Seatac plans to address the behavioral health crisis. It's mentioned in the forum that behavioral health has been an ongoing crisis for years now and is one of four major topics on the legislative agenda from the meeting. I was wondering if legislative agendas 1) Increasing workforce development opportunities for young adults and 3) Behavioral Health are hand-in-hand.

I ask because, according to the King County Executive's proposed levy to improve the state of behavioral health availability, they plan on recruiting and retaining the behavioral workforce by offering apprenticeship programming and access to higher education, credentialing, training, and wrap-around supports. Does Washington State representative Tina L. Orwall plan on recruiting high school students and young adults to help create more mobile or site-based crisis behavioral health services? I would love to get involved.

How does King County also plan to provide opportunities for behavioral and mental health services for people without health care? Do you need to qualify for health care seeing as there are no freely available walk-in health crisis facilities? It's mentioned on the King County Executive's proposed levy that DESC's Crisis Solutions Center requires a referral, so how does King County plan to address this?

Finally, I would like to know if King County, to expand behavioral health outreach, would talk with local high schools. In my freshman year, the Kent Teen Clinic representatives gave students in my Health class cards to advertise their facilities and services. It's something to consider, as high school students especially need it after the pandemic.

That's all my questions about the most recent city council meeting. If you have any questions, please let me know.
