- 3. Project briefings are intended as opportunities to both inform and facilitate input from the Commission on project activities.



Anticipated project completion by March 2024.




# CITY CENTER/AIRPORT DISTRICT SUBAREA PLAN PROJECT OVERVIEW

- Identification of refinements to vision and development concept underway.


#### **NEXT STEPS:**

Percent Type of Connection to SeaTac



When you think of a vibrant place and the positive experiences of a city center, central business district, or downtown, what activities and places come to mind? (Open-ended responses)





My "Big Idea" for SeaTac City Center/Airport District is... (Open-ended responses)





#### **WORKSHOP RECAP**

### **July 18-20 Community Design Workshops**


- Three-day workshop at McMicken Heights Elementary, 12 sessions each day.
- Main Goal: To get input from residents, businesses, and others on how the district can become a more vibrant, walkable, urban place.
- Sessions: Some open to public, some by invitation, included:
  - Residents
  - Businesses/Property Owners/Agencies
  - Community Based Organizations (CBOs)
  - City's Citizen Advisory Committees
  - Airport Workers (session focused on that topic)





### **Attendee Commentary Summarized**

- Broken and damaged powerline / telephone wires on 166th next to the park.
- Would like to see this land be used for conference spaces or hotels.
- 3 A walkway or pedestrian bridge to be able to easily flow people over.
- Blind intersection on 34th Ave. and 176th. Limited visibility from 34th E. to 176th.
- Limited visibility from S. 179th St. turning left or right onto Military Rd.
- 6 Is there a connection here for emergency access on 180th?
- Port opportunity? A sort of campus for people oriented space.
- 8 Wally Park Street
- City easement
- 10 Opportunity for people oriented space.
- (11) Opportunity for people oriented space.
- (12) A quality space where people desire to be more.
- 13 Sound Transit Guideway Property



#### **BUSINESSES**

### The City could help business owners by:

- Exploring ways to prolong and encourage tourists/visitors to stay in SeaTac
- Providing better communication and coordination regarding construction activities in the area

### The City Center/Airport District is missing:

- A commercial/retail hub with shopping, public market, or other retail that draws people into the City and keeps them there
- Restaurants and a diversity of food choices
- 24-hour childcare and/or more flexible SeaTac based in-home affordable childcare options (especially in-home)



#### **BUSINESSES – PART 2**

Discussion topics at large business/property owners/agencies meeting:

- Interest in having more restaurants and activities for people to walk to in the district
- Concern about whether there is sufficient parking for visitors (similar concerns were shared about parking for airport employees)
- Discussion about building parking structures to address parking issues
- Interest in making International Boulevard easier to cross for pedestrians



#### **RESIDENTS**

#### Would like District to include:

- More places to walk such as mixed-use developments with street level shops, restaurants, and entertainment
- Bow Lake as a publicly accessible destination
- Better sidewalk infrastructure
- Recognition, inclusion, and preservation of cultural and natural assets of community
- Places that celebrate the City's diversity



#### **RESIDENTS - PART 2**

#### Concerns that were shared:

- Skepticism about district's growth vision
- Concern about new developments in the district impacting existing residents and neighborhoods
- Questions about the effects of pollutants throughout the City such as air pollutants, noise concerns, environmental pollutants and lack of green space that inhibits residents from enjoying outdoors
- Concerns about safety especially safer places to walk (including better and more sidewalks)



### **COMMUNITY BASED ORGANIZATIONS (CBOs)**

#### Would like district to include:

- More green space, specifically parks
- There are many children in the district who do not have access to safe open spaces to play

#### Concerns that were shared:

- Can be difficult to find news about City activities
- Recommend that City staff to come to community-based events to help build trust with SeaTac's various communities



# 2024 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT PROCESS

### **ABOUT THE PROCESS**

- Opportunity for community to propose changes to Comprehensive Plan
- Generally, a two-year process with applications due in even-numbered years and Council action in odd-numbered
- Amendments to Comprehensive Plan and development regulations can be proposed

#### PROCESS KICKED OFF IN AUGUST

Applications due October 20, 2023

### Who May Apply?

Any individual, property owner, neighboring jurisdiction, Council, Board, Commission or City staff-member may propose an amendment.

To ensure holistic consideration of all changes to the Comprehensive Plan, the amendment process will be incorporated into the Envision SeaTac 2044 project.

- 5) City Council adoption of proposed amendments (before end of 2024)
