5. Call to Artists for Art in the Park Program	Mary Tuttle, Parks & Recreation Director and Rita Marlow, Arts, Culture & Library Advisory Committee Chair presented an overview and background of the pilot program for Art in the Park. The proposed location for the pilot program is Riverton Heights Park. The Call to Artists will be issued September 25 with applications due November 30. The anticipated installation is fall 2024. The Arts Culture & Library Advisory Committee will be responsible for artist selection. Community engagement opportunities for the community to help co-create pieces will be in February-March 2024.

6. Angle Lake Park Pier & Boat Ramp Update	Michael presented the history and current condition of the existing pier and boat ramp. In 2022, the community helped select a conceptual design for a replacement pier and staff began to move forward with the chosen design. After discussion and more review, staff discovered a variance would be needed for the new design to conform to the SeaTac Shoreline Master Program. Mitigation requirements administered by the Washington State Department of Fish and Wildlife are also a concern due to the size of the proposed pier.	
	Staff are going to work with an aquatics consultant to ensure the new fishing pier design will enhance swimmer safety and not conflict with lifeguard access to the swimming area The goals of the new pier design will accommodate swimming and fishing in appropriately designated areas as well as provide water access to individuals with mobility limitations. Improving safety, function, and access are the goals for renovations to the fishing pier and boat ramp. Staff will return to the Parks & Recreation Committee with a refined design.
