City Vision Poll Background

Time Span: August to November 2023

Responses: 251, 72% (180) online, 28% (71) in person

Activities/Outreach:

- Online: Poll was on project website in English, Amharic, Somali, Spanish, and Vietnamese
 - Social media utilized to advertise the poll.
- Displays/Physical Copies: Display posters with QR codes to online poll and hard copies were available at the Community Center and City Hall
- In-Person: Project staff did in-person surveying at Back-to-School Fair, Tyee Titans Day, Community Resources Fair, Community Meal Night, Great Pumpkin Night
 - Raffling of Safeway gift cards used as incentive for participants to take the poll





Question 10 - What is your relation to the City? Check all that apply.








Question 11 – If you live in SeaTac, what neighborhood do you live in?



Question 12 – What race best describes you?



Question 13 – Are you Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin?




Question 14 – Do you own or rent your home?

EXAMPLE: INTEGRATING FINDINGS INTO VISION STATEMENT UPDATE

Comprehensive Plan's Current Vision Statement (2015):

The City hereby pledges its commitment to achieve the following vision for the future of the SeaTac community.

The City of SeaTac is envisioned to be economically strong, environmentally sensitive, visually pleasing, and people-oriented with a socially diverse but cohesive population and employment mix. These attributes create a positive identity and image for the community and contribute to a city of the future that works.

The essence of a growing, prosperous, and vibrant City of SeaTac is found not in its built or natural environment alone but in the collective spirit of those who live and who work within the SeaTac community.

The built aspects of this community—its residential and commercial structures, transportation network, park and recreation facilities, utility systems and other public and private facilities, as well as the natural environmental setting—are not considered as ends in themselves, but as means for enhancing the quality of life and enriching the human spirit.



PHASE 2 CONTINUED WORK: WHERE & HOW WILL SEATAC GROW-NEXT STEPS FOR POLICY UPDATE PROCESS

MULTI-STEP REVIEW & CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR COMMISSIONERS

- Review current Comprehensive Plan Element and related background report
- Understand key proposed changes to goals and policies
 - Utilize "Policy Review Matrix" to understand sources of proposed changes (matrix includes columns that identify state or regional planning requirements, other)
 - Background report updates may not align with policy review schedule



- Provide comment on changes and discuss with other Commissioners and project staff.
- Confirm proposed changes for public review.


PROPOSED CHANGES IDENTIFIED IN ADVANCE OF PROJECT (cont.)

- Key Updates to Consider for All Elements
 - Integrate New Information: Integrate community input, new data, and City priorities, including those identified in recent studies and plans such as the Housing Action Plan.
 - Refine Key Growth & Development Policies: Clarify and strengthen City's foundational growth policies, specifically, the Urban Center/urban village strategy, complete communities goals, and others.
 - Enhance Community Identity: Address community identity through strategies that contribute to a sense of place and enhance community wellbeing.
 - Integrate Social Equity Principles: Ensure social equity is addressed throughout the Comprehensive Plan in line with local and regional goals
 - Ensure Regional Alignment: Demonstrate compliance with state and regional requirements, including those related to access to opportunity, equity, addressing historically underserved communities, climate change, affordable housing, and others as established in state legislation (including HB1220), PSRC Vision 2050, and the King County Countywide Planning Policies.
 - Include Actionable Implementation Strategies: Ensure strategies provide clear guidance to the community and City regarding regulations, infrastructure, services, and other actions needed to implement the Comprehensive Plan
 - Clarify and Streamline Comprehensive Plan: Ensure each chapter addresses how it supports
 the City's growth vision and complies with the state/regional planning framework, other.

PHASE 2 CONTINUED WORK: NEXT STEPS FOR POLICY UPDATE PROCESS

EXAMPLE: STREAMLINING LAND USE DESIGNATIONS & ZONES Why?

- Some land use designations and zones are very similar and have redundant/overlapping characteristics that could be "unified" to clarify their purposes and make the code easier to understand and use
- Recent legislation from 2020 (HB 1220) and the new "middle housing" legislation (HB 1110) require changes to regulations that could be addressed by consolidating some zones
