SUMMARY

On 4/16, the Planning Commission will continue work on tasks related to the Envision SeaTac 2044 project's Phase 2, "Where and How Will SeaTac Grow." The main focus of the work session will be a review of the first draft of proposed changes to the Land Use Element and its growth and development strategies. In addition to work on the Envision project, staff will also present a brief overview of the status of the three other "Planning Our City Together Projects" currently underway including the Transportation Master Plan (TMP) update, City Center subarea plan, and Citywide Parking Code projects.

ENVISION SEATAC 2044: LAND USE ELEMENT - FIRST DRAFT REVIEW

The main goal of the April 16 work session is for the Planning Commission to understand and provide initial comments on the first draft of proposed changes to the Land Use Element. Project staff will use the Policy Review Matrix template, which the Planning Commission reviewed previously, to highlight proposed changes to goals and policies identified to date. (A copy of the matrix will be provided to Commissioners after the meeting). Changes to goals and policies that describe existing land use designations within the Comprehensive Plan map are still being developed and will not be presented at Tuesday's meeting.

PROPOSED UPDATES TO CITYWIDE GROWTH STRATEGY

The most significant Land Use policy changes to be discussed on Tuesday, are those related to proposed refinements to the City's overall growth strategy. While the updated Citywide Growth Strategy continues to focus on concentrating new housing and job growth within the Urban Center and urban village/subareas adjacent to light rail stations (see <u>current Land Use Policy 2.1A</u>), the refined growth strategy clarifies and expands on urban village and complete communities strategies to increase opportunities to access housing, jobs, infrastructure and services citywide. The proposed changes were guided by recommendations from the Housing Action Plan and also align with the growth scenario options discussed at the Commission's January and February growth scenario work sessions.
