SUMMARY

The main goals of the upcoming 4/30 Envision SeaTac 2044 work session are:

- To discuss the Planning Commission's comments and questions on proposed changes to goals and policies identified within the Land Use Element Draft 1 Policy Review Matrix presented at the 4/16 meeting, and
- 2) To introduce the Commission to the types of content and information that will be provided within the new Urban Center and Neighborhoods chapters of the Comprehensive Plan.

DISCUSS COMMISSIONER COMMENTS ON LAND USE ELEMENT DRAFT 1 PROPOSALS

In the first part of Tuesday's work session, project staff will facilitate a discussion on Commissioners' comments on the Land Use Element Draft 1 proposals that were presented in the "policy review matrix" at the 4/16 meeting. Commissioners have the option of providing comments before the meeting in the following ways:

INTRODUCTION TO URBAN CENTER AND NEIGHBORHOODS CHAPTERS

During the second part of the 4/30 work session, project staff will provide an introduction to the Urban Center and Neighborhoods chapters. The presentation will include the following:

- Background on why the City is creating the new Urban Center and Neighborhoods chapters
- Urban Center Chapter overview:
 - Description of existing conditions in the Urban Center (including information on the City Center and S 154th Station and Angle Lake Station urban villages)
 - o Policy guidance to be included within the chapter related to:
 - Compliance with regional growth policies, especially Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) Regional Growth Center (RGC) requirements,
 - Supporting and implementing SeaTac's updated growth strategy including promoting increasing access to opportunity through the development of "Centers, Villages, and Complete Neighborhoods."
- Neighborhoods Chapter overview:
 - o Description of existing conditions in neighborhoods outside of the Urban Center, and
 - o Policy guidance to be included within the chapter related to:

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- Supporting and implementing SeaTac's updated growth strategy, specifically around creating high quality, livable Neighborhood Centers, Corner Stores, and Complete Neighborhoods throughout SeaTac.
- Providing a policy basis for compliance with new state requirements for allowing middle housing (HB 1110) and at least two accessory dwelling units (HB 1337) within properties currently zoned for single-family uses.
