### Dear Mayor, Councilmembers, Residents, and Employees:

#### 2011 Summer Lunch Program report

The Des Moines Food Bank provided 5,529 free lunches and snacks at the following sites in the City of SeaTac: McMicken Heights Elementary, Matt Griffin YMCA, Angle Lake Park, Valley Ridge Park and Madrona Elementary. As an organization, they provided over 14,000 free lunches and snacks to children at 10 sites between the cities of SeaTac and Des Moines.

#### South 154th Street Improvements – Full Road Closure Schedule

The full road closure of S. 154th Street from 32nd Avenue S. to 24th Avenue S. has been extended to December 31, 2011. This closure is necessary to construct several key improvements as part of the City of SeaTac's South 154th Street project. The closure will allow R.W. Scott Construction Company to safely expedite conversion of overhead utilities underground, construct utility crossings, and work on the SR518 bridge. Accelerating the completion of these items will shorten the overall duration of the project, minimize the project's impact to the neighborhood, and provide a safe working environment on the SR518 bridge.

Traffic through the road closure area is restricted to emergency vehicles and local traffic that does not have an alternate route to their destination within the project limits. Through traffic is being detoured to International Boulevard, S. 144th Street, and 24th Avenue S. The traveling public should expect delays related to construction activities and the City recommends that alternate routes be considered. Appropriate notification, signage, and traffic control will be used to manage traffic through the detour route.
