Other Business	X Informational Update Recommended for: ApprovalApproval with modificationsDenial Referred to:  • Robinson summarized the selection process to date for new committee appointments and described next steps.  • Fire Marshall Jon Napier gave a presentation on the Enhance 911 system and discussed the proposed new ordinance related to compliance with State statutes for lodging establishments. The committee discussed the issues with regard to full compliance and suggested a less punitive approach that allowed for a cure period prior to the levying of fines. Napier indicated that he would discuss the matter with the Legal Department and see if the proposed ordinance could be modified. He agreed to communicate through Robinson to the committee regarding the outcome of those discussions.  • Representatives of the Angle Lake Shore Club and Angle Lake Manor Club described some of the activities that they sponsor for the community, including the 4th of July fireworks display, parade and swimming competition. They asked the committee for direction in how to approach local businesses for future support for their programs and activities.  • The committee voted to cancel the August meeting.
