Budget Workshop

The City will be holding the first in a series of Budget Workshops in Council Chambers at SeaTac City Hall on Friday, October 7 starting at 9 AM. The agenda can be found on the City's website.

S. 138th Sidewalk Project Complete

On September 28, the City celebrated the completion of its second Neighborhood Pedestrian Project at a Ribbon Cutting ceremony for the S. 138th Street Sidewalk Project. New, pervious sidewalk has been installed along both sides of S. 138th Street from 24th Avenue S. to Military Road S., as well as a blinking crosswalk signal at 24th Avenue S. and S. 138th Street. Faith Deliverance Assembly generously hosted the event in their parking lot at 2642 S. 138th Street. Bishop Williams, Mayor Anderson, Councilmember Fernald and Councilmember Shape shared in cutting the ribbon.



The Neighborhood Pedestrian program is a twenty year program, which will install sidewalks along 12.5 miles of roadway, at a cost of \$1.5 million annually.

Sound Transit Open House

On Wednesday, October 5 Sound Transit will hold an open house on the S. 200th Street light rail extension. The Open house will be held at SeaTac City Hall, Council Chambers, 4800 S. 188th Street, from 5 - 8 PM.

Design is underway for the extension of Link light rail between the SeaTac/Airport Station and S. 200th Street. This project will extend light rail approximately 1.6 miles from S. 176th Street to S. 200th Street, where a station and park-and-ride will be located. The open house is an opportunity to review the station, guideway and parking design elements, proposed public art elements and bicycle and pedestrian access improvements. Steppin' Out to Stop Domestic Violence

On September 10, 2011, over a hundred people made their views clear: "There's NO PLACE for domestic violence in our community" by walking a 5K walkathon beginning and ending at Tyee Educational Complex. This Sixth Annual "Steppin' Out to Stop Domestic Violence" walkathon included a midway stop at the Hilton Hotel, continuing south on International Boulevard and east on 188th Street.

The City of SeaTac Domestic Violence Task Force collaborated in the fundraising effort for local domestic violence agencies. A big thank you goes to the City of SeaTac Fire and Police Explorer's Programs who provided traffic control and monitored the safety of walkers. Walkers were rewarded with hot dogs and drinks at the end of their journey.

Fall Special Recycling Event

This event is for King County residents only – no commercial loads accepted. Bring the following materials to be recycled on Saturday, October 1, from 9 AM to 3 PM to the Tyee Educational Complex parking lot: appliances, refrigerators/freezers (\$20 cash fee per each refrigerator/freezer), scrap metal, batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, oil, antifreeze, transmission and steering fluids (**no gas or brake fluid; no mixed fluids**), tires, clothing and reusable household goods, and EPS Styrofoam. Please note that only computer peripherals such as keyboards, mice, and printers are accepted at our recycle events.



Free Confidential Material Shredding

LeMay Mobile Shredding will be providing secure document destruction services at the October 1 Fall Special Recycling Event. Limit three boxes per vehicle.

Televisions, computers, computer monitors, and laptops are no longer accepted at our recycle events. Call 1.800.RECYCLE or visit 1800recycle.wa.gov to find authorized electronic product recycling services in your area. **E-cycle Washington sites will accept televisions, computers, computer monitors, and portable or laptop computers throughout the year for free.** Households, small businesses, schools and school districts, small governments, special purpose districts, and charities can recycle electronic products free of charge.

Rain Barrel Sale for SeaTac Residents Only

Saturday, October 1, from 9 AM to Noon, or until they are sold out.

Please note the rain barrel sale will be held at the Special Recycling Event site at the Tye Educational Complex, and not at City Hall.

These rain barrels will help you harvest untreated rain water by simply hooking it up to your down spout. For only \$25 each (subsidized by King County Waste Reduction and Recycling grant funds), these 60-gallon rain barrels have a mesh screen on top, a brass hose bib spigot, and an excellent overflow system. Limit two per customer, and cash only please. Please bring proof of residency with you.

SeaTac Fire Department Quickly Extinguishes Arson Fire

On September 22, at approximately 03:15 AM, SeaTac Engines 45, 46, Battalion 45 and mutual aid units were dispatched to a house fire in the 3000 block of S. 208th Street. On arrival Engine 45 found active fire inside a vacant house that was for sale, and initiated an attack on the fire. Battalion 45 arrived and established command. Other units assisted with the quick extinguishment. Mutual aid was provided by South King Fire & Rescue and Port of Seattle Fire Departments. Investigation determined the cause to be arson. Damage is estimated at \$60,000. There were no injuries.

SeaTac Fire Department Assists Tukwila Fire at Rendering Plant Fire

On September 25, at approximately 3:30 PM, SeaTac Engine 47 was dispatched with mutual aid, with Tukwila units, for two-alarm fire at Baker Commodities. Engine 47 was assigned to relieve Tukwila Engine 52 and extinguish product contained in a vertical auger tube. Engine 47 forced open the top of the machinery to gain access and was able to attack and extinguish the fire.


SeaTac Fire Department Responds to Four CPR's in One Week

In an unusual coincidence, the SeaTac Fire Department has responded to four people in cardiac arrest in the last week. These included three women ages 22, 23 and 78 and a 48 year old male. The Fire Department and Medic One personnel were able to successfully resuscitate two of the patients and they were transported to Highline Hospital.
