Open House for the S. 164th Street Sidewalk Project – 34th Avenue S. to Military Road S.

The Engineering Division of the Public Works Department will be hosting an Open House for the S. 164th Street Sidewalk project at City Hall on February 15, from 5:30 to 7:30 PM in Council Chambers. The purpose of this meeting is to present the final design and provide updated construction project schedule information. City staff will provide information to the public regarding the impacts of the project on the neighboring properties and the traveling public. The public involvement process will continue throughout the duration of the construction project through individual meetings with the adjacent property owners as needed.

The goal of the project is to improve neighborhood connectivity, improve the safety of pedestrians, and provide sidewalks on the safe walking route to McMicken Heights Elementary School. Improvements include adding sidewalks, upgrading the storm drainage system, and pavement restoration. The City plans to begin construction in the late spring or early summer of 2012. The project is expected to be complete within six to eight months of the start date. Please contact the Project Manager, Toli Khlevnoy, at 973.4736 for additional information.

This project is the third annual Neighborhood Pedestrian Program project. The Neighborhood Pedestrian Program was developed by an Ad Hoc Committee appointed by the City Council. The goal of the Program is to build 12.5 miles of sidewalk within SeaTac neighborhoods over a twenty year period. Passport applications are now being accepted Monday through Friday 9:00 AM to 12:00 Noon and 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM. Service is being increased January 2012 through March 2012 on a trial basis only. If these increased times are beneficial to the City and residents, it will continue indefinitely.

Highline Schools Foundation Announces 2012 Seattle-Tacoma International Airport Scholarships

Each year, thanks to the generous support of employees from the Port of Seattle and HMS Host and airport contractors, Highline Schools Foundation is able to provide the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport Scholarship Program to graduating Highline School District seniors.

This needs-based scholarship program awards three students who are pursuing a college education. Two \$14,000 scholarships will be awarded toward a university/college education and one \$8,000 scholarship will be awarded toward a vocational or community college education. All scholarships are distributed over a 2 year period. Priority is given to students who have not received a substantial scholarship from other entities.

SeaTac Fire Assists in Baby Delivery on I-5

On February 2, at approximately 6:15 AM, SeaTac Fire Aid 45 was dispatched to a reported eighteen year old female in labor on northbound Interstate 5 near south 188th Street. On arrival Aid 45 found a female 38 ½ weeks pregnant having contractions less than a minute apart, her water had broken and she was feeling like the baby was ready to be delivered. The mother advised that the patient was a high risk pregnancy and needed to be transported to University of Washington Hospital. Medic 13 arrived and after a quick evaluation, determined that the patient needed to be transported rapidly. Medic 13 began transport, with SeaTac personnel on-board for assistance. While en-route to UW Hospital, Medic 13 pulled over, and at approximately 6:45 AM a healthy baby boy was delivered. Medic 13 continued to the University of Washington Hospital where mother and child were taken straight to Labor and Delivery.



Firefighter Survival Training & Emergency SCBA Operations

During the last two weeks of January, SeaTac firefighters participated in Firefighter Survival Training and emergency Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) operations. The training involved three skill stations: (1) Emergency escape from upper floors, (2) SCBA Confidence Course/Mayday Procedures/Emergency SCBA Operations, (3) Firefighter Rescue/Mayday/Rapid Intervention Crew deployment. The training was delivered by the SeaTac/Kent/Maple Valley Fire Training Consortium, with Tukwila and Burien/North Highline Fire Departments also participating.

- W-2s or other statements for you and your spouse from ALL your employers
- · Picture ID
- Social Security card or ITIN number and birthdates for everyone on your return
- Any 1099 Forms (for income from interest, dividends, retirement, social security or unemployment)
- Name, address and taxpayer identification number of child care provider if you pay for daycare
- Records of student loan payments
- Records of payments for educational expenses, such as college tuition
- Mortgage interest and property tax statements if you own a home
- Bank account number, for direct deposit
- A copy of last year's tax return, if you have it
- If filing jointly, both filer and spouse must be present to file electronically


