### 2012 Spring Recycling Event - Saturday, April 7

Bring the following materials to be recycled Saturday, April 7, from 9 AM to 3 PM to the Tye Educational Complex parking lot: appliances, refrigerators/freezers (\$20 cash fee per each refrigerator/freezer), scrap metal, batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, oil, antifreeze, transmission and steering fluids (**no gas or brake fluid**), tires, clothing and reusable household goods, and EPS Styrofoam. Please note that only computer peripherals such as keyboards, mice, and printers are accepted at our recycle events.

LeMay Mobile Shredding will be providing secure document destruction services at the April 7 Spring Recycling Event. Limited to three boxes per vehicle.

Televisions, computers, computer monitors, and laptops are no longer accepted at our recycle events. Call 1-800-RECYCLE or visit [1800recycle.wa.gov](http://1800recycle.wa.gov) to find authorized electronic product recycling services in your area. **E-cycle Washington sites will accept televisions, computers,**

**computer monitors, and portable or laptop computers throughout the year for free.**

Households, small businesses, schools and school districts, small governments, special purpose districts, and charities can recycle electronic products free of charge.

**Police News**

Police Chief Jim Graddon took advantage of a great opportunity earlier this week to attend the International Conference for Police and Law Enforcement Executives hosted in Seattle. The theme for the two day conference was "leading in times of crisis". Chief Graddon reports that the sessions were very much on point for the challenges facing law enforcement and other government leaders in times of budget constraints and media scrutiny. These concerns are by no means a local problem but are actually global in their impact. He was pleased to have the chance to hear experts speak of strategies, and the clearest message was that of consistent and persistent communication – among professionals, to our public, to our staff and with our elected and government officials. The Sheriff's Office was gracious in covering the registration for our Chief.

**Three People Sickened by Carbon Monoxide Poisoning**

On March 31, at approximately 5:30 PM, SeaTac Fire Engine 47 was dispatched to an unknown type aid call in the 13000 block of 26th Avenue S. The dispatch center was having difficulty in determining the exact nature of the call due to a language barrier. While Engine 47 was responding, the call was upgraded to CPR for a three-year-old. This added North Highline Engine 19, Medic 4 and Battalion 45. Engine 47 arrived and found that it was not a CPR, and instead found three people suffering from apparent Carbon Monoxide (CO) poisoning. The

patients included a woman in her 50's, a male in his 20's and a 3 year old male. Engine 47's crew removed the occupants to fresh air and along with Engine 19 and Medic 4 treated the three. All occupants were transported to Harborview Medical Center and were expected to spend some time in the hyperbaric chamber at Virginia Mason. All are expected to survive. The cause of the poisoning was the result of the occupants running a generator in the basement of the home. The power had been shut off by City Light for an undetermined length of time. Fire Department CO monitor readings were in excess of 900 parts per million which can cause symptoms including dizziness, nausea, and convulsions within approximately 30 minutes.

### **Automatic Fire Sprinkler System Saves Apartment Building**

On March 21, at approximately 8:30 PM, SeaTac Fire Engine 45 and Battalion 45 were dispatched to an automatic fire alarm at an apartment complex in the 3100 block of S. 208th Street. On arrival Engine 45 found that unattended food cooking on the stove had resulted in a kitchen fire on the third floor, which had been extinguished by the automatic operation of the sprinkler system. The operation of the sprinkler system also triggered the fire alarm, summoning the fire department. Crews shut down the sprinkler system, searched the occupancy and ventilated the smoke from the structure. Building maintenance arranged for the restoration of the sprinkler system.
