Healthy Kids Day at Matt Griffin YMCA

On Saturday, April 28, from 10:00 AM - 1:00 PM, the Y is celebrating Healthy Kids Day®, a national initiative of the YMCA to improve the health and well-being of kids. More than 1,900 YMCA's across the country are taking part in the celebration with free community events for families, meant to kick start physical activity and learning throughout the summer.

Bridge Work to Begin on S. 154th Street Project

R.W. Scott, the City's contractor, is scheduled to begin work on the S. 154th Street Bridge over SR 518. The work involves removing and replacing the railing across the bridge. For safety reasons, WSDOT requires that a portion of this work be done at night with lane closures on SR 518. Lane closures along the bridge deck are also required throughout the duration of the work to protect workers and the traveling public. These lane closures are scheduled from April 16 through May 11. This schedule is weather dependent and may vary. Appropriate advance notification, signing and traffic control will be used. The traveling public should expect delays related to construction activities and alternate routes should be considered. The City appreciates our community's continued patience with these improvements to S. 154th Street. The project is anticipated to be complete by this summer. 9-1-1 Citizen Academy

On March 31, Councilmembers Pam Fernald and Barry Ladenburg took advantage of a unique learning experience offered through our Police Department. Police calls in our city are handled by the King County Sheriff's Office Communications Center. The Communications Center has instituted a "9-1-1 Citizen Academy", a one day course that exposes the students to the procedures for handling emergency and non-emergency calls from those needing police, fire or medical assistance. Attendees were allowed to "plug in" with call receivers and dispatchers to experience first-hand how these calls for service are handled. Our Councilmembers reported that they were impressed with the operation



and the academy. We will hopefully be able to share information on additional academies in the future.

Care Under Fire

During the week of April 2, several members of our Police Department received training on "Care Under Fire". The objective of this training is to educate our officers on how to help themselves or others who have been injured while engaging dangerous armed suspects. Fire and medical aid personnel may be unable to reach such victims given that many situations are simply too dangerous to enter. Officers will now have additional equipment to address these life-threatening injuries until the situation is stable enough for additional assistance. The training was conducted by active duty military personnel who have recent, real-life experience in combat situations. The week culminated in "mock scene" scenarios held in our own City Hall. The officers, under the direction of the trainers, went through real time exercises in which they had to treat "wounded" colleagues while still engaging with armed violent suspects. This is all part of

broader grant-funded training and equipment purchases that will expand our Police abilities to respond to these very dangerous calls.

Active Shooter Training

On Wednesday through Friday of this week our Police Department conducted training for all city staff on what to do if we have an "active shooter" situation in City Hall or other of our facilities. The hour long sessions, put on by Officer Hansen Hsu and Sergeant Ted Boe, were intended to make staff aware of what can happen, some options to consider if faced with this, and how the police will respond to such a circumstance. The information was intentionally kept very basic and was meant to generate discussion and thoughtful pre-planning in the event something like this happens. Police and Human Resources will be looking at updating city policies and procedures for these types of occurrences. Chief Graddon expresses his appreciation for the interest the staff had in the presentations.


