Upcoming Labor Rally Impacts Travel along International Boulevard

Working Washington, a labor union coalition, has scheduled a rally to recognize airport workers on Saturday, April 28. The rally is expected to begin at approximately 12:00 PM at the Airport Flag Pavilion located at S. 182nd Street and International Boulevard. After the rally, various represented labor groups will march south on International Boulevard to Angle Lake Park. During this time, only the inside southbound lane will be open to traffic and northbound lanes should not be affected. Traffic control measures are expected to be installed beginning at approximately 10:30 AM. As this event will be causing some congestion in the area, the public is being advised to adjust their schedules for traffic delays and impeded accessibility to the businesses along the route. Healthy Kids Day at Matt Griffin YMCA

On Saturday, April 28, from 10:00 AM - 1:00 PM, the Y is celebrating Healthy Kids Day®, a national initiative of the YMCA to improve the health and well-being of kids. More than 1,900 YMCA's across the country are taking part in the celebration with free community events for families, meant to kick start physical activity and learning throughout the summer.

New Futures

Police Chief Jim Graddon recently had the privilege of participating as a panel member in the New Futures Scholarship Selection Committee. New Futures is a non-profit organization in our communities, with a program operating in our city at the Windsor Heights apartment complex. Their staff partners with families and educators to ensure that children succeed in school and in life. They have integrated, culturally relevant programs in low-income apartment complexes and work to build skills, foster connectedness, and promote strength in youth and their families. New Futures offers three scholarships each year to selected program members. The recipients will be acknowledged at the New Futures 7th annual "Get Inspired" breakfast held the morning of June 5, at the Seattle Grand Hyatt Hotel. Transit upgrades lead to greener commutes in SeaTac

Commutes are "greener than ever" for employees that work in SeaTac, according to a 2011 survey of commute habits at sixteen of SeaTac's largest work sites, representing over 5600 employees.

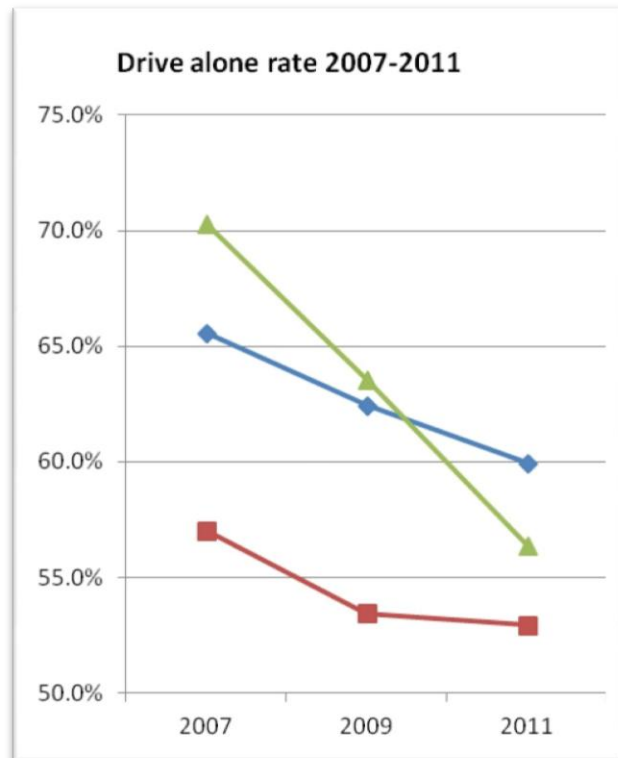
The Commute Trip Reduction (CTR) goal set by the state for this group of employer sites was to reduce the drive-alone rate by 7 percentage points from 2007 to 2011. The SeaTac drive alone rate actually decreased by 14 percentage points - double the CTR goal!

The percentage of employees from this group that currently ride the bus to work increased from 8.5 percent in 2007 to 15.5 percent in 2011, while train and light rail commuting increased from 1 percent to 4 percent during the same period.

Additionally, carpooling, vanpool use, and walking to work each have increased significantly during this time as well.

These impressive results are in no small part due to recent transit improvements in the SeaTac area, which include the addition of Metro Transit's RapidRide A Line bus system and Sound Transit's Link Light Rail. Going forward, this trend continues to look bright due to the advent of Metro's RapidRide F Line in Fall 2013 traveling east/west along S. 154th Street between Burien and Renton, and the 2016 southward extension of Link Light Rail operations from the Airport to S. 200th Street.

At the end of the school day, several students who had participated in the self defense workshop volunteered to briefly demonstrate the skills they were taught against Sergeant Boe, wearing a FIST impact training suit which allowed students an added level of realism to their course. Sergeant Boe and Officer Hsu ended the workshop with a dual demonstration of proper movement, proper angling, defensive stance, impact, and counter drills, also utilizing the same impact training suit.

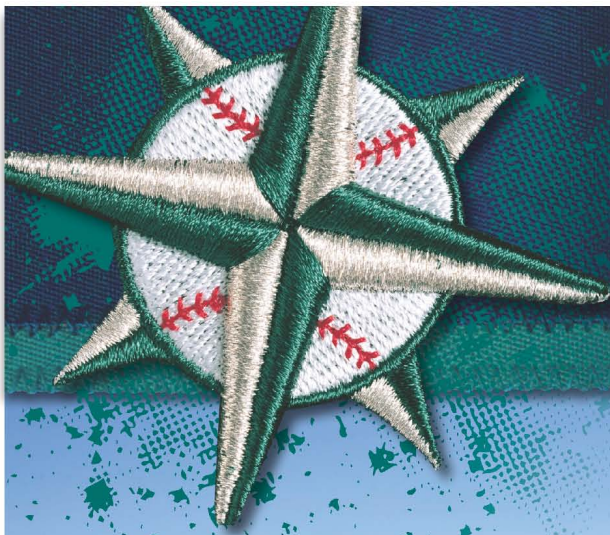
