

INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL IN SEATAC TO CELEBRATE THE ETHNIC DIVERSITY OF THE REGION

SeaTac, Wash., May 24, 2012 - The City of SeaTac will host the 16th Annual International Festival beginning Saturday, June 23 through Sunday, June 24 at Angle Lake Park.
