2012 Annual Overlay Project – Construction Begins

On August 6, Tucci & Sons, Inc. will begin construction of 2012 Overlay Project. The scope of work for this year's overlay project includes spot drainage, sidewalk and pavement repairs on S. 188th Street between International Boulevard and 46th Avenue S. The majority of the pavement repairs will take place on the westbound lanes. The goal of this project is to maintain the existing roadway and storm drainage infrastructure.

The traveling public should expect delays related to the intermittent lane closures due to construction activities. Appropriate notification, signage, and traffic control measures will be used during construction. The project is expected to be complete by the first week of October. Please consider alternate routes. The City regrets any inconvenience to the community and asks for your patience during construction. Road Closure on S. 154th Street for final paving

Starting Monday, August 13, a full road closure will be in effect on S. 154th Street, 24th Avenue S. to 32nd Avenue S., for final paving. The road closure is expected to last through August 17 (weather dependent). Traffic through the road closure area will be restricted to emergency vehicles only and local traffic that does not have an alternate route to their destination within the project limits. Through traffic will be detoured to International Boulevard, S. 144th Street, and 24th Avenue S. The traveling public should expect delays related to construction activities and the City recommends that alternate routes be considered. Appropriate signage, notification and traffic control will be used to manage traffic through the detour. A detour map is attached.

The City regrets any inconvenience to the community and appreciates your patience while we work to complete S. 154th Street. The goal of the project is to improve traffic operations and increase the safety of motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists. Improvements include new sidewalks, turn lanes, bicycles lanes, and relocation of overhead utilities underground.

SeaTac Fire Participates in 2012 UASI Regional Aviation Pre-Exercise Training

On July 30, seven SeaTac firefighters attended aviation safety & rescue training to prepare for the upcoming 2012 UASI Regional Aviation Exercise, scheduled for August 29, in south King County. The Regional Aviation Exercise is being coordinated by the King County Sheriff's Office, Snohomish County Sheriff's

Office, Pierce County Sheriff's Office, Washington State Patrol, Seattle Police, U.S. Navy, and U.S.

Coast Guard. The overall objective for the exercise is to demonstrate the ability of the Seattle UASI Regional Aviation partner organizations to be interoperable with federal, state, and local agencies by communicating and operating collectively during aviation operations to include "command and control" and "emergency response."

Pre-exercise training included review of personal protective equipment, landing zone safety, cold loading and hot loading helicopters, hoisting operations, and transport of rescuers on an aerial platform.



Rope Rescue Training

On July 17, 19, and 20, SeaTac Firefighters attended technical Rope Rescue training at the Kent Fire Department Training Center, along with firefighters from Kent, Maple Valley, and Tukwila. Rescuers reviewed rope rescue equipment, mechanical advantage systems, and anchor systems. Rescuers practiced rappelling, operating lowering devices, belay lines, and moving victims in a high-angle environment. Emphasis was placed on rescuer and victim safety.

SeaTac Firefighters Attend Rescue Swimmer Training

July 9 - 14, eleven SeaTac Firefighters attended Rescue Swimmer training along with firefighters from Kent and Maple Valley. The Rescue Swimmer—Inland Basic module was focused on the inland open water environment to include areas such as lakes or ponds of various sizes. The swimmer was able to improve their swimming technique and was introduced to swimmer adjuncts. Safety of the swimmer was a high priority. Emphasis was placed on dealing with victims in the open water environment, including interventions and medical management. The students practiced both shore and boat based open water search techniques, as well as recovery of submerged victims.

Citizen Advisory Committee Vacancies

The Senior Citizen Advisory Committee's Mission is to work with the Staff Liaison to identify issues related to senior citizens in the community; act as an advisory body to the City Council and provide input through the City Manager and the Staff Liaison to the City Council on issues relating to SeaTac senior citizens; provide increased opportunities for community involvement by SeaTac senior citizens and the community in general; advise the City Council, through the City Manager and the Staff Liaison regarding the delivery of senior citizen

programs and provide outreach to the community in an effort to develop and place senior citizen issues before the citizens of the City of SeaTac in a positive manner.

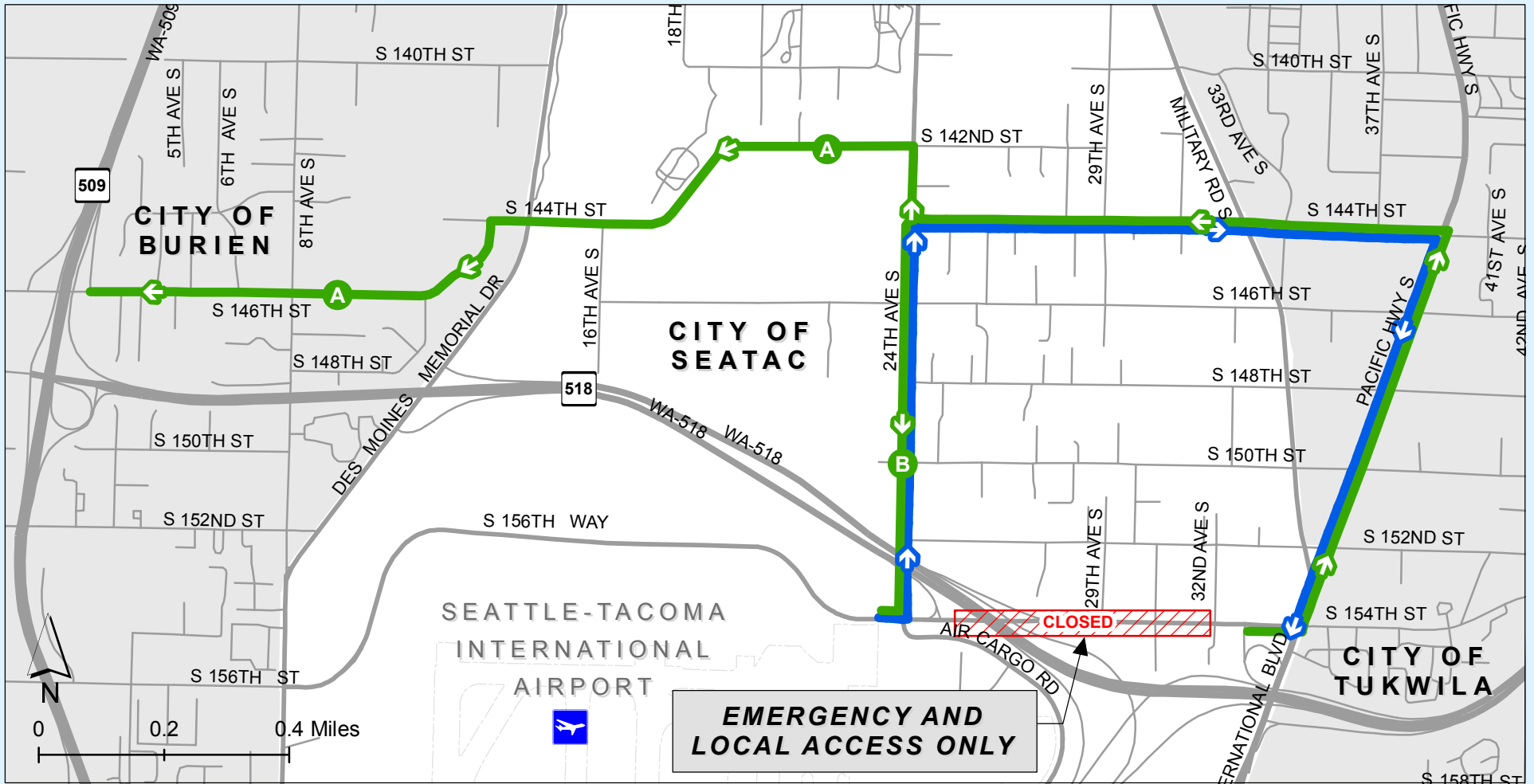
