

City Manager's Weekly Update

May 29, 2009

Dear Mayor, Councilmembers, Residents, and Employees:

Fire Sprinkler System Saves Buildings: In April, Battalion and Engine 45 were called to an automatic fire alarm at the Sandpiper Apartments "A" building. Upon investigation they found a fire sprinkler head activated in one of the small storage rooms in the back of the complex. It was reported that some kids had been playing with matches in the area. The Fire Department found several dozen match sticks around the exterior of the storage unit and a bottle of lighter fluid lying just inside the door. The fast acting fire sprinkler system had extinguished the fire, resulting in no damage to the building.

On May 11, Battalion and Engine 45 were again called to an automatic fire alarm at the Sandpiper Apartments, this time at "G" building. Engine 45 entered and found that the fire sprinkler had activated in a bedroom of the apartment and had extinguished most of the fire. The fire was caused by a candle left burning with no one home.

In less than a month, the fire alarm system extinguished two potentially serious fires and prevented major damage.

SeaTac Rescue 45 Assists Tukwila: On May 22, at approximately 8:00 PM, Tukwila Fire was dispatched to a call where a vehicle collided with an apartment building at the Foster Creek Apartments on Macadam Road. At approximately 9:00 PM, SeaTac Rescue 45 was dispatched to assist Tukwila by providing scene lighting since it was starting to get dark. Rescue 45 used the onboard generator, built in flood lights, and light towers to illuminate the scene, helping assure personnel safety until the vehicle was extricated from the building.

Volunteer Effort at Valley Ridge: On Saturday, May 16, the Lokahi Foundation worked at improving the landscaping around the City's tennis courts at Valley Ridge Park. They installed approximately 50 medium sized shrubs and 125 groundcover plants, as well as applying a fresh layer of mulch. Their efforts were overseen by the SeaTac Parks Department which appreciates their assistance with this landscape improvement.
