### 2012 Annual Overlay Project Construction Begins

On August 6, Tucci & Sons, Inc. began construction of the 2012 Overlay Project. The scope of work for this year's overlay project includes spot drainage, sidewalk and pavement repairs on S. 188th Street between International Boulevard and 46th Avenue S. The majority of the pavement repairs will take place on the westbound lanes. The goal of this project is to maintain the existing roadway and storm drainage infrastructure.



The traveling public should expect delays related to the intermittent lane closures due to construction activities. Appropriate notification, signage, and traffic control measures will be used during construction. The project is expected to be complete by the first week of October. Please consider alternate routes. The City regrets any inconvenience to the community and asks for your patience during construction. ## **“Soldiers of Social Work” Awards Given to Members of Our Police Department**

In a moving presentation at our Regular Council Meeting on August 14, three members of our SeaTac Police Department received the “Soldier of Social Work” Award from the Children of the Night organization out of Los Angeles. Dr. Lois Lee, president and founder of Children of the Night, came here to recognize the work done by Detectives Brian Taylor and Joel Banks, and Officer Andy Conner. Our three officers are deeply involved in forming and supporting the Genesis Project, a non-profit program helping young women victims of the sex trade to escape their abusers and reconstruct their lives. During the presentation two girls who had been victims told their very compelling stories to the Council and the public, emphasizing the importance of programs such as Children of the Night that aided in their escape from abusive circumstances. The fledgling Genesis Project may well become a model for other such programs.

### **Citizen Advisory Committee Vacancies**

The City of SeaTac has immediate vacancies on the Planning Commission and Senior Citizen Advisory Committee.

The Planning Commission is to study and make recommendations to the City Council for adoption of long range comprehensive plans, policies, programs and services related to land use, transportation and community facilities. The Commission also studies and makes recommendations to the Council on a variety of development regulations. The Commission’s goal is to maintain and achieve the highest level of the City’s attributes so that all SeaTac citizens can enjoy and be proud to live in this community. Planning Commissioners are appointed by the Mayor and Council. The Commission consists of five members, each serving three-year terms. Meetings are held on the first and third Tuesday of each month at SeaTac City Hall.

The Senior Citizen Advisory Committee consists of five members, each serving three-year terms. Committee members are appointed by the Mayor and City Council. The Senior Citizen Advisory Committee’s Mission is to work with the Staff Liaison to identify issues related to senior citizens in the community; act as an advisory body to the City Council and provide input through the City Manager and the Staff Liaison to the City Council on issues relating to SeaTac senior citizens; provide increased opportunities for community involvement by SeaTac senior citizens and the community in general; advise the City Council, through the City Manager and the Staff Liaison regarding the delivery of senior citizen programs and provide outreach to the community in an

effort to develop and place senior citizen issues before the citizens of the City of SeaTac in a positive manner. Meetings are held on the third Tuesday of each month at SeaTac Community Center.

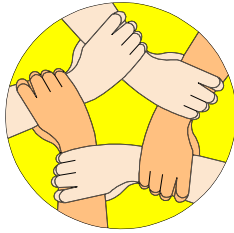
