



Current Trends or Series:

Both Part I & Part II crime increased (12% & 28% respectively).

Commercial burglary up from 3 to 13. December 2012 has the highest monthly number since January 2009. Four incidents occurred at hotels (different MOs) & six occurred at apartment complex mail rooms, storage rooms, or laundry rooms (coin thefts). Approx. seven of these coin thefts have occurred in SeaTac since December 2012; most involved the use of a torch. A male, Clyde M. Taylor (B/M, 10/09/1960), believed to be acting as a lookout was arrested on 12/21/12 in SeaTac. His accomplice has not been identified. Det. Fry is the lead detective.

Residential burglary increased significantly & is above the 7-year average (21).

Multiple incidents of car windows shot with BBs occurred in December 2012 in the cities of SeaTac, Burien, Kent, & some in unincorp. Auburn/Fed. Way as well. A POI was identified through a suspect vehicle, Pranil P. Prasad (B/M, 06/23/1992). A W/M associate has not been identified. Suspect vehicle was WA 988WYI, 1995 blue Subaru Legend SW. Incidents stopped after media reports. Det. Gillette is the lead detective.
