Angle Lake Park Project

The Angle Lake Park Phase II project bid opening was January 29, and the results are below. This item will be placed on the February 12, Regular City Council Agenda as an Action Item. The reference checks have been completed on the low bidder Henderson Partners, LLC and they were all very positive. Henderson Partners, LLC have stated they are ready to start working and said they can complete the project before the International Festival in June. The City has a budget of \$1,775,226 for construction after the water spray equipment purchase in the 2013 Capital Budget for the Angle Lake Park Phase II project. The low bidder is \$375,807 under the construction budget.

SeaTac Fire Assists North Highline at House Fire

On January 20, at approximately 3:00 PM, SeaTac Engine 47 was dispatched to assist the North Highline Fire Department at a house fire. The first arriving engine confirmed that there was fire in the basement and made an attack on the fire from the back of the structure. The fire had

extended to the first floor and Engine 47 was assigned to attack the multiple areas of fire extension on the first floor. The fire was extinguished and overhauled. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

SeaTac Fire Assists Burien at Apartment Fire

On January 28, at approximately 4:40 PM,

SeaTac Fire Engines 45, 46, and 47 were dispatched to assist Burien Fire Department units at an apartment fire, in the 1200 block of SW 124th Street, which would grow to three-alarms. Initial arriving units found an apartment unit fully involved and rapidly spreading and began attacking the fire. SeaTac Fire units assisted Burien with searching the structure, lighting and overhaul of the burned units. Battalion 45 served as the Zone Coordinator, ensuring coverage for all of the areas that had been vacated by the large response to the fire.

Early Morning SeaTac Apartment Fire

SeaTac Fire Investigators are working to determine what started an apartment fire on January 29, in the 3000 block of S. 154 Street at 4:37 AM. The two alarm fire heavily damaged one apartment on the second floor of the three story complex. Quick work by SeaTac firefighters limited the fire damage to the one unit, though some water did seep into a downstairs apartment. Because the building has a common interior hallway that all apartments lead to, smoky conditions forced many people to shelter in their apartments or to go out onto their balconies. Only the apartment where the fire began is uninhabitable. All of the other residents were returned to their homes once firefighters confirmed that it was safe to do so. Three people were treated at the scene for minor injuries and no one was transported to the hospital. Mutual aid was provided by Tukwila, Burien, North Highline, South King Fire & Rescue, and Port of Seattle Fire Departments.

According to investigators, the second floor fire was intentionally set in multiple locations of the affected unit. The single occupant that the apartment is registered to has not been located and was not home when firefighters arrived. The King County Sheriff's department is now leading the investigation. The South King County Fire Investigation Task Force is asking for the public's help. Anyone with information about the fire is asked to call the Arson Tip Line at 253.856.4460 and leave a message. All information is confidential and callers may be eligible for a reward if the information provided leads to an arrest and prosecution. If someone needs to speak with an on-call investigator, they can call 9-1-1.

What to bring to the tax site:

- W-2s or other statements for you and your spouse from ALL your employers
- Picture ID (new requirement)
- Social Security card or ITIN number and birth dates for everyone on your return
- Any 1099 forms (for income from interest, dividends, retirement, Social Security or unemployment)
- Name, address and taxpayer identification number of child care provider if you pay for day care
- Records of student loan payments
- Records of payments for educational expenses, such as college tuition
- Mortgage interest and property tax statements, if you own a home
- Bank account number, for direct deposit
- A copy of last year's tax return, if you have it
- If filing jointly, both filer and spouse must be present to file electronically


