### Senior Program Acknowledges Efforts of Christine Lee

Thanks go to Christine Cloutier Lee a Recreation Leader 2 for the Senior Program. Recently Christine's quick reaction to a medical emergency at the Senior Program helped save a senior's life. Christine was driving the senior van and taking seniors home from lunch. While still in the parking lot at the Community Center, she noticed a senior in his car. She stopped the van, and observed that he had not moved. When she approached the vehicle she observed that the individual had been sick. Though the man was conscious and talking, Christine did not like how he looked so she called 911 and alerted other staff. The individual was transported to the hospital. He ended up having a heart attack and life-saving measures were taken. After a stay in ICU, the senior is now home

Christine's concern and quick action helped save this senior's life. It would have been very easy to miss the individual in his car, not to notice his condition or dismiss his symptoms to the flu and bug that have been going around everywhere. Christine did none of the above. She acted with her instinct, training and concern. Her quick response brought this individual the medical intervention that was needed to save his life. We are very fortunate to have Christine as part of our team!

# Walker Preserve Invasive Plant Removal 2013 Winter-Spring Schedule Saturdays from 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM

February 9 March 16 April 20 May 18



#### Where:

Walker Preserve Park, SW 168th Street and 2nd Avenue SW in Normandy Park, up the road from Normandy Park City Hall. If driving, your parking options include:

- Three spaces in the small lot at SW 171st Street and Second Avenue SW
- On the street along SW 168th Street

From the gate behind the Walker Preserve sign, walk down the trail towards the creek.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Please plan ahead – this park does not have a restroom.

#### **Activities:**

• Seek out English ivy and remove it from trees and pull roots out of the ground. Seek out Himalayan blackberry plants, cut them back, and then dig out the root balls. Plant native plants. Activities may vary each month.

#### What to bring:

- Your enthusiasm
- Clothing that will protect you from the rain and blackberry thorns
- Filled water bottle, gloves if you have them

# **CERT Training Session Begins March 14**

CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) training is a Citizen Corp and FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Association) supported curriculum and promotes a partnering effort between emergency services and the people that they serve. The goal is for emergency personnel to train members of neighborhoods, community organizations, or workplaces in basic preparation and response skills. CERT members are then integrated into the emergency response capability for their area.

SeaTac and Burien fire and police departments partner in offering this eight-week training held on weekday evenings, with a Practical Final Exercise held on a Saturday. Sessions require approximately 20 hours to complete. There is a \$35.00 fee to cover the partial cost of CERT supplies, including a backpack, hard hat, goggles, 4-in-1 tool and a fully stocked first aid kit.

Training is designed to cover the following:

- Disaster Preparedness
- Fire Safety
- Disaster Medical Operations
  - o Triage
  - o Treating Life Threatening Injuries
  - Assessment, Treatment and Hygiene
- Light Search and Rescue
- Team Organization
- Disaster Psychology
- Terrorism
- Final Exercise

# What to bring to the tax site:

- W-2s or other statements for you and your spouse from ALL your employers
- Picture ID (new requirement)
- Social Security card or ITIN number and birth dates for everyone on your return
- Any 1099 forms (for income from interest, dividends, retirement, Social Security or unemployment)
- Name, address and taxpayer identification number of child care provider if you pay for day care
- Records of student loan payments
- Records of payments for educational expenses, such as college tuition
- Mortgage interest and property tax statements, if you own a home
- Bank account number, for direct deposit
- A copy of last year's tax return, if you have it
- If filing jointly, both filer and spouse must be present to file electronically


