COUNTYWIDE PLANNING POLICIES
2012 AMENDMENTS

KING COUNTY COUNTYWIDE PLANNING POLICIES (CPP)

- Establish countywide framework for city
 Comprehensive Plans
- Adopted in cooperation with cities
- ✓ Under purview of Growth Management Planning Council (GMPC):
 - □ Electeds from King County Council, Seattle Council, Bellevue Council, suburban cities' councils

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

- ✓ Only the Housing-related Amendments are relevant to SeaTac
- ✓ The other amendments pertain to
 - Schools in the rural area, and
 - Minor adjustments to the Urban Growth Boundary in east King County

HOUSING-RELATED AMENDMENTS

- Represent the work done by the staff of south-county cities last year,
- ✓ In cooperation with
 - staff from other King County cities
 - GMPC staff
- ✓ In response to issues raised by south-county cities in the summer of 2011, questioning the equity of the affordable housing allocation requirements in the CPP
- ✓ Substantially the same as provided in a 4/24/12 Study Session briefing

SUMMARY OF HOUSING-RELATED AMENDMENTS

- ✓ Eliminate affordable housing targets for each jurisdiction
- ✓ Establish countywide affordable housing need
- ✓ Focus on strategies to meet the need
- Establish steps to accomplish this approach

STEPS ESTABLISHED IN CPP

- Conduct housing supply inventory and needs assessment
- 2. Include existing level of affordable housing to establish share of countywide need
- 3. Implement policies and strategies to address unmet need
- 4. Measure results
- Respond to results with reassessment and adjustment of strategies

NEXT STEPS

Council action scheduled – Feb. 28 RCM COUNCIL OPTIONS

- 1. Ratify CPP Amendments (pass the Resolution)
- 2. Formally disapprove the Resolution
- 3. Take no action
 - equivalent to ratification

AMENDING CPP

Requires

- ✓ GMPC endorsement June 6, 2012
- ✓ Adoption by King County Council Dec. 3, 2012
- ✓ Ratification by at least "30% of city and county governments representing 70% of the county population" Current Step

RATIFICATION CRITERIA - WHAT'S NEEDED?

"30% of governments representing 70% of county population"

THAT IS

- 12 governments representing 1,369,900 people:
- Seattle has to be on board
 - All other governments together, including unincorporated King County, only total 68% (1,340,500)

RATIFICATION CRITERIA - WHAT'S NEEDED?

- ✓ BUT Seattle can't do it alone
 - □ 30% of governments (12) have to ratify
 - Seattle's population is 616,500 i.e., not 70%
- √ 753,400 more needed e.g.,
 - King County (unincorporated)
 - Bellevue
 - Kent
 - Renton
 - Federal Way
 - Kirkland
