Comprehensive Plan Update Open House

Would you like to see a change in the City's Comprehensive Plan or Development Regulations? If so, plan to attend an Open House from 5:15 to 6:00 PM on Tuesday, March 5 in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

NOTE: The regular meeting of the SeaTac Planning Commission will follow the Open House, beginning at 6:00 PM.

The purpose of this Open House is to provide information about the Comprehensive Plan in general, the Major Comprehensive Plan Update, and the 2013 Annual Comprehensive Plan and Development Regulations amendment processes. Information will include process, schedule, and applications for proposing an individual amendment to the Comprehensive Plan, or to the Development Regulations (Zoning Code). Staff will be available to answer any questions that citizens may have.

The deadline to submit your amendment application is **Friday**, **March 29**.

Citizen Advisory Committee Vacancies

The City of SeaTac has immediate vacancies on the Library Advisory Committee and Tree Board.

Both of these committees serve in an advisory capacity to the SeaTac City Council with five members each, serving three-year terms.



The Library Advisory Committee coordinates with, and provides input to, the Board of Trustees of the King County Library District and local library official. Meetings are held quarterly on the second Tuesday of the month, or as needed, at Valley View Library or SeaTac City Hall at 5:00 PM. The Library Advisory Committee is looking for candidates to fill one unexpired term.

The Tree Board makes reports and recommendations to the City Council concerning a comprehensive Public Tree Care Plan for the Parks & Recreation and Public Works departments, Public Tree Hazard Assessment and Inventory, and implementing an Arbor Day Observation/Celebration and Proclamation. Meetings are held on an as-needed basis at SeaTac City Hall. The Tree Board is looking for candidates to fill one expired term.

Fire Department Rescues Impaled Driver

On February 22, at about 2:00 AM, City of SeaTac Fire Department emergency units were dispatched to a report of a vehicle off the road and in a ravine in the 15600 block of Des Moines Memorial Drive South. The first arriving emergency unit found a car with the injured driver still in the car approximately 100' down a ravine along the side of the roadway. The car had driven through a fence as it left the roadway and the top rail of the fence impaled the driver.

Due to the slope of the ravine a Zone 3 Technical Low Angle Rope Rescue response was initiated which provided trained technical rope rescue personnel from neighboring fire departments to assist. Technical Rescue personnel with equipment responded from City of SeaTac, Port of Seattle, Burien, Renton, Tukwila, Kent, Medic One and South King Fire and Rescue.

The first arriving SeaTac Fire Department unit made access to the vehicle and found the injured driver still in the vehicle. He was awake and able to talk and tell rescue personnel he was the only person in the car at the time of the crash. SeaTac rescue personnel cut the rail off and extricated the driver from the vehicle, treated and stabilized the driver while a technical rope system was assembled to assist bringing the patient back up to the roadway. The driver was placed in a litter and hauled back up the hill to the road. The patient was transported to a local hospital for more definitive care of serious injuries.

The SeaTac Police Department is investigating the cause of the single vehicle crash.

911 Citizens Academy

On April 13, Valley Communications Center in Kent is sponsoring an academy to introduce the public to the exciting world of Emergency Communications. See the attached flier for more information about what this eight-week program will cover and how to register.

CERT Training Session Begins March 14

CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) training is a Citizen Corp and FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Association) supported curriculum and promotes a partnering effort between emergency services and the people that they serve. The goal is for emergency personnel to train members of neighborhoods, community organizations, or workplaces in basic preparation and response skills. CERT members are then integrated into the emergency response capability for their area.

SeaTac and Burien fire and police departments partner in offering this eight-week training held on weekday evenings with a Practical Final Exercise held on a Saturday. Sessions require approximately 20 hours to complete. There is a \$35.00 fee to cover the partial cost of CERT supplies, including a backpack, hard hat, goggles, 4-in-1 tool and a fully stocked first aid kit.

Training is designed to cover the following:

- Disaster Preparedness
- Fire Safety
- Disaster Medical Operations
 - o Triage
 - Treating Life Threatening Injuries
 - o Assessment, Treatment and Hygiene
- Light Search and Rescue
- Team Organization
- Disaster Psychology
- Terrorism
- Final Exercise

SeaTac Firefighter Attends Pump Academy

During the week of February 25, Firefighter John Wilkins attended a 5-day pump academy that reviewed apparatus inspections, pump testing, drafting, relay pumping, and basic fire attack operations. Both classroom and hands-on drills were conducted throughout the week. The training was delivered at the Kent Fire Training Center and the Washington State Fire Training Academy in North Bend. Firefighter Wilkins will become a shift instructor on C-shift.

Firefighter Survival Training & Emergency SCBA Operations

An average of 100 firefighters die in the line of duty each year. To address this continuing national occupational fatality problem, the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) conducts independent investigations of firefighter line-of-duty deaths. Based on the recommendations in the NIOSH investigation reports, SeaTac firefighters continue to receive fire ground survival training.

On February 21-22, SeaTac and other local firefighters participated in Firefighter Survival and Emergency SCBA Operation training (Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus) at a vacant house in Maple Valley. The training involved three skill stations:

- Firefighter rescue through a basement floor collapse
- Firefighter rescue through an exterior wall
- SCBA Confidence Course/Mayday Procedures/Emergency SCBA Operations

The training was delivered by the South King County Fire Training Consortium, with SeaTac, Kent, Maple Valley, Tukwila, and Burien/North Highline participating.



What to bring to the tax site:

- W-2s or other statements for you and your spouse from ALL your employers
- Picture ID (new requirement)
- Social Security card or ITIN number and birth dates for everyone on your return
- Any 1099 forms (for income from interest, dividends, retirement, Social Security or unemployment)
- Name, address and taxpayer identification number of child care provider if you pay for day care
- Records of student loan payments
- Records of payments for educational expenses, such as college tuition
- Mortgage interest and property tax statements, if you own a home
- Bank account number, for direct deposit
- A copy of last year's tax return, if you have it
- If filing jointly, both filer and spouse must be present to file electronically


