(Stormwater Outreach for Regional Municipalities), Washington State Puget Sound Partnership and Washington State Department of Ecology. The program is designed to harness collective energies to help improve Puget Sound by reducing the amount of storm water pollution that eventually ends up in the Sound.

City of SeaTac Honored as a WellCity

The City of SeaTac was recently honored with the WellCity Award by the Association of Washington Cities (AWC). This is the City's ninth consecutive WellCity Award.

The AWC Employee Benefit Trust's annual WellCity Awards recognize members that meet nine best practice standards for employee health promotion. Members of the AWC Employee Benefit Trust are eligible to apply for the award. This includes cities, towns, and non-city entities. SeaTac was one of 83 Trust-insured cities to earn the 2013 WellCity Award. WellCity has three levels of recognition to encourage program growth and longevity. SeaTac has earned the WellCity Award of Excellence. This is the highest level of recognition.

AWC Trust members that earn the 2013 WellCity Award receive a 2% premium discount on Regence BlueShield/ Asuris Northwest Health premiums. The discount will be applied to 2014

premiums.
Receiving this award is estimated to save the City \$46,000 on medical premiums in 2014.
