

Camp Compassion

SeaTac Teen Camp, in partnership with SeaTac Police and King County, will become Camp Compassion the week of July 22 - 26.

The mission of this week is to teach young people about the humane treatment of animals, the environment, themselves and others. During the week campers will have verbal instruction through games and activities. While much of the instruction will be at Valley Ridge Park the most important part of the training will come from volunteering at the Regional Animal Shelter of King County (RASKC), where they will have a chance to interact directly with the animals. The week will culminate on Friday from 12:00 PM – 3:00 PM with an Adoption Event at Valley Ridge Park where the animals that have had the extra training with the teens will be available for adoption. RASKC is also having a limited time special of \$50 on adoption fees for dogs which includes spay or neutered, microchip, vaccinations and health exam. The fee on adult cats is free. There will also be hamburgers and hotdogs available for a donation to RASKC. If you are available, come on over to Valley Ridge Park on July 26 to see the animals and grab some lunch.

Citizen Advisory Committee Vacancies

The City of SeaTac has immediate vacancies on the Library Advisory Committee, Tree Board, Senior Citizen Advisory Committee, and Planning Commission.

These committees serve in an advisory capacity to the SeaTac City Council with five or more members, each serving three year terms.

The Library Advisory Committee coordinates with, and provides input to, the Board of Trustees of the King County Library District and local library official. Meetings are held quarterly on the second Tuesday of the month, or as needed, at Valley View Library or SeaTac City Hall at 5:00 PM.

The Tree Board makes reports and recommendations to the City Council concerning a comprehensive Public Tree Care Plan for Parks and Public Works Departments, Public Tree Hazard Assessment and Inventory, and implementing an Arbor Day Observation/Celebration and Proclamation. Meetings are held on an as needed basis at SeaTac City Hall.

The Senior Citizen Advisory Committee's Mission is to work with the Staff Liaison to identify issues related to senior citizens in the community; act as an advisory body to the City Council and provide input through the City Manager and the Staff Liaison to the City Council on issues relating to senior citizens in the SeaTac community. Meetings are held on the third Tuesday of each month at 9:00 AM.

The Mission of the Planning Commission is to study and make recommendations to the City Council for adoption of long range comprehensive plans, policies, programs and services related to land use, transportation and community facilities. The Commission also studies and makes recommendations to the Council on a variety of development regulations. Meetings are held on the first and third Tuesday of each month at 5:30 PM.

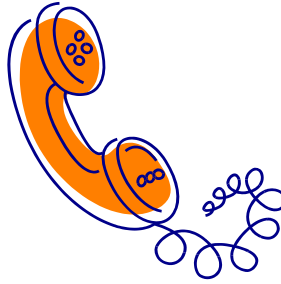
