

COOKING OIL FIRE DISPLACES FAMILY

City of SeaTac, Wash. July 26, 2013 – A family of six was fortunate to escape with no injuries after water was thrown on a stovetop fire where cooking oil had ignited.

The two adults and four kids will be staying with family following the fire in the 16000 block of Military Rd. S.

The fire, which was first reported at 6:26 pm, started while the family was heating oil to cook with. One of the occupants threw water on the fire hoping to extinguish it. This caused the fire to spread as the burning oil was splashed all over the kitchen.

The fire damaged all of the appliances, walls, and cabinets. Firefighters were able to extinguish the fire quickly and keep it from spreading. Smoke damage was evident throughout the house.

Always cook with the lid of the pan you are using close by. In the event of a fire, place the lid on the pan while wearing an oven mitt to extinguish the flames. Slowly move the pan to an unused burner and turn off the hot burner. Do not lift the lid.

Call 9-1-1 if you are not sure that the fire has been completely extinguished.
