S. 200th Street Closed August 3

The City of SeaTac is continuing to work with Sound Transit on the extension of high capacity transit further into South King County. Currently under construction is the S. 200th Link Extension. This coming Saturday between 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM all lanes will be closed on S. 200th Street at the intersection of "little 28th Avenue S." in SeaTac.

National Night Out

National Night Out is Tuesday, August 6. National Night Out began in 1984 as an effort to promote involvement in crime prevention activities, police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie to send a strong anti-crime message to potential criminals. SeaTac neighborhoods have participated for many years. There are 21 events currently planned around the City, with 500 projected attendees.



Operation Cross Country

On August 23, 25 and 27, SeaTac Street Crimes Detectives participated with the FBI and other law enforcement agencies in "Operation Cross Country". Operation Cross Country is part of the Innocence Lost National Initiative that was created in 2003 by the FBI in partnership with the Department of Justice and the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC). The sweep took place in 76 cities and was carried out by the FBI in partnership with local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies and the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) as part of the Bureau's Innocence Lost National Initiative. It is the seventh and largest such enforcement action to date, resulting in the recovery of 105 sexually exploited children and the arrests of 150 pimps and other individuals nationwide.

Cooking Oil Fire Displaces Family

On July 26 at approximately 6:30 PM, SeaTac Engine 46 and 47, Battalion 45 along with mutual aid units were dispatched to a reported spreading stove fire in the 16000 block of Military Road South.

The fire started while the family was heating oil to cook with. One of the occupants threw water on the fire hoping to extinguish it. This caused the fire to spread as the burning oil was splashed all over the kitchen. The fire damaged all of the appliances, walls, and cabinets. Firefighters were able to extinguish the fire quickly and keep it from spreading. Smoke damage was evident throughout the house.

The family of six was fortunate to escape with no injuries. The two adults and four kids will be staying with family. Always cook with the lid of the pan you are using close by.

In the event of a fire, place the lid on the pan while wearing an oven mitt to extinguish the flames. Slowly move the pan to an unused burner and turn off the hot burner. Do not lift the lid.
