

Community Volunteers 'Step Up for SeaTac' at the City's 1st Annual Litter Cleanup Event

On Saturday, September 14, over 75 volunteers came together at the SeaTac Community Center at 9:00 AM to 'Step Up for SeaTac' and help in the first organized city-wide litter cleanup event. Volunteers gathered into groups and were assigned areas in the city, given gloves, trash pickers, safety vests, and garbage bags.

Volunteers worked two and a half hours cleaning up in their designated areas and bagging the trash. City trucks were dispatched to pick up bags throughout the event. Volunteers worked in three parks and covered almost six and a quarter miles of City streets, collecting 101 bags of trash, for approximately one ton of litter.

Airport Noise Study Briefing September 24

A Port of Seattle Commission update on the Draft Federal Aviation Administration Part 150 Noise and Land-Use Compatibility Study is scheduled for September 24 in the International Auditorium, Mezzanine Level, at the Conference Center at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport. The public session begins at 1:00 PM.

Port staff will update the Commission on input received during the public comment period and the noise mitigation recommendations included in the Part 150 Study Draft Commission Resolution. The Resolution is scheduled for review by the Commission in October.

The Library Advisory Committee coordinates with, and provides input to, the Board of Trustees of the King County Library District and local library official. Meetings are held quarterly on the second Wednesday of the month, or as needed, at Valley View Library or City Hall at 5:00 PM.

The Tree Board makes reports and recommendations to the City Council concerning a comprehensive Public Tree Care Plan for Parks and Public Works Departments, Public Tree Hazard Assessment and Inventory, and implementing an Arbor Day Observation/Celebration and Proclamation. Meetings are held on an as needed basis at City Hall.

Road Closure Beginning Tuesday at S. 192nd Street and 28th Avenue S.

Please be advised that Sound Transit's contractor PCL Constructors will be closing S. 192nd Street from Tuesday, September 24 to Friday, September 27 at the intersection of 28th Avenue S. in SeaTac.

The purpose of this full closure is to construct substructure components that are associated with the proposed Angle Lake Station Light Rail project on both sides of the intersection on 28th Avenue South.
