Transportation Listening Sessions October 9 & 14

On October 9 and October 14, Washington State Senate transportation leaders will host public meetings to seek input on statewide transportation needs. The meetings will begin at 6:00 PM and last until 9:00 PM, featuring presentations from regional transportation officials as well as an opportunity for public comment.

The City plans to comment at the meetings alongside other partners advocating for the completion of SR 509. The coalition—including the Port of Seattle, other benefitted cities, labor representatives and business advocates—encourages interested businesses, residents and organizations to also attend and support the completion of SR 509 and SR 167, now joined as the Puget Sound Gateway Project. Meetings are held on an as needed basis at SeaTac City Hall.
