- Pilot Program = \$5,000 max
- City Match per Project = \$5,000 max
- Neighborhood : City Match = 4:1 min
- Non-Commercial
- Eligible Project Examples:
 - Neighborhood Identity Signs
 - Community Gardens, Play Areas
 - Neighborhood Events (Block Watch, Map Your Neighborhood)
 - Street Lights (non-arterial)
 - Secure Mailboxes
 - Artwork

- Selection
 - Criteria:
 - Scope, type, and location of Project
 - Readiness, Participation
 - Consistency with Council Vision and Goals
- Pilot Program Process:
 - Announcement of Pilot with application acceptance dates
 - Review of applications, presentation to Council
 - Awarding of grant fund(s)

- Application
 - General Requirements:
 - Detailed budget with reliable cost estimates
 - Verification of Neighborhood Match
 - Physical Improvements:
 - Detailed drawing of project, detailed site map, location of Project
 - Community Event Projects:
 - Complete description of Project Event
 - Description of how funds will be spent
 - Required permission of property where Event will be held
