Kent RFA Citizens Advisory Committee Opening

On January 1, 2014, the SeaTac Fire Department began a contract for services with the Kent Fire Department Regional Fire Authority (RFA). Because of this, the Kent Fire Department RFA's Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) is seeking to add a member from SeaTac.

The purpose of the CAC is to review, validate, and gather resident input on strategic deployment and planning documents for the RFA and work with the RFA staff to develop recommendations to the RFA Governance Board regarding planning documents for the RFA. The CAC may also provide additional input, feedback and guidance to the RFA staff and RFA Governance Board on issues critical to developing a strong relationship between the community and the RFA.

The member selected by the Governance Board's interviewing process shall be appointed for a three (3) calendar year term or until the member's successor is appointed.

To qualify, the applicant must have been living within the SeaTac city limits for at least two years.

Fire at Angle Lake Park Restroom Building

Around 2:00 AM on Thursday, December 26, a fire was started in a portable toilet at Angle Lake Park. The portable toilet had been placed adjacent to the restroom building while the restrooms were temporarily closed in order to repair pipes that broke during the cold weather. The fire damage is estimated at \$40,000 and the City has filed a claim with our insurance company. Even with the fire damage, the restrooms are open and functional until they can be repaired.

Citizen Advisory Committee Vacancies

The City has immediate vacancies on the Planning Commission, Human Services Advisory Committee, Library Advisory Committee, and the Tree Board. These committees serve in an advisory capacity to the City Council with five members each, serving three year terms.

The Planning Commission is looking for candidates to fill one expiring term. This commission studies and makes recommendations to the City Council for adoption of long range comprehensive plans, policies, programs, and services related to land use, transportation, and community facilities. The Commission also studies and makes recommendations to the Council on a variety of development regulations. The Commission's goal is to maintain and achieve the highest level of the City's attributes so that all SeaTac residents can enjoy and be proud to live in this community. Meetings are held on the first and third Tuesday of each month at SeaTac City Hall.

The Human Services Advisory Committee is looking for candidates to fill one expiring term. This committee makes reports and recommendations to the City Council concerning human services issues. Meetings are held on the third Monday of each month at SeaTac City Hall beginning at 5:30 PM.

The Library Advisory Committee is looking for candidates to fill one expired term. This committee coordinates with, and provides input to, the Board of Trustees of the King County Library District and local library official. Meetings are held quarterly on the second Wednesday of the month, or as needed, at Valley View Library or SeaTac City Hall at 5:00 PM.

The Tree Board is looking for candidates to fill one expired term. The Tree Board makes reports and recommendations to the City Council concerning a comprehensive Public Tree Care Plan for the Parks and Public Works departments, Public Tree Hazard Assessment and Inventory, and implementing an Arbor Day Observation/Celebration and Proclamation. Meetings are held on an asneeded basis at SeaTac City Hall.
