



City Manager's Weekly Update May 30, 2014

Recology CleanScapes Set to Start Services in SeaTac on June 1

Recology CleanScapes will provide garbage, recycling and food & yard waste collection for SeaTac households, businesses and establishments beginning June 1. If you currently receive collection of these materials you do not need to do anything. All services will be transferred from the previous hauler to Recology CleanScapes on this date.

Some customers may experience a change in collection day. Confirmation of your collection day was included in your "Welcome Packet" which was





New rates are slightly lower for most residential customers. Commercial and multi-family customer rates vary depending on container size and collection frequency, but many rates are also lower. In addition to lower rates, new service options are available that can help you waste less and save more:



- For residential customers, food & yard waste service will now be included with your garbage service at *no additional charge!* As before, recycling service will continue to be provided at no additional charge.
- For commercial customers, unlimited recycling service will now be included with your garbage service at *no additional charge!*

Starting June 2, you may sign up for service or change your container size by calling Customer Service at 767.1166 or by submitting the appropriate online form.

Citizen Advisory Committee Vacancies

The City has vacancies on the Community Building Committee and the Library Advisory Committee. These committees serve in an advisory capacity to the City Council, assisting in decision-making and the setting of City policies.

The Community Building Committee is looking to fill one expired term. The new member will be appointed for a term ending April 23, 2016. The Community Building Committee is charged with researching best practices of other jurisdictions and vetting those ideas within the community, fostering communication and building trust with all City departments and within the community, acting as a sounding board for projects and programs under development by the City, seeking innovative, community-based ideas through sustainable, two-way communication within the community, and participating in existing city, school, and community meetings and events to bridge communication gaps and promote active participation and community engagement. Meetings are held the 4th Wednesday of every month at 5:30 PM at SeaTac City Hall. Applications for the Community Building Committee will be accepted until June 13 at 5:00 PM.

The Library Advisory Committee is looking for candidates to fill two terms expiring on August 25. The Library Advisory Committee serves in an advisory capacity to the City Council and also coordinates with and provides input to the Board of Trustees of the King County Library District and the local library official. Meetings are held on an as needed basis at SeaTac City Hall or at the Valley View Library. Members are appointed for three-year terms. Applications for the Library Advisory Committee will be accepted until July 18 at 5:00 PM.

All positions are appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Council.

Police Respond to Home Invasion Robbery – 12800 block of 24th Avenue S.

At about noon on Tuesday May 27, two to four subjects broke into an occupied residence, armed with at least one handgun and assaulted the residents inside. One shot was fired into the residence, there were no injuries. Suspects fled the area before officers from the SeaTac, Burien and unincorporated King County arrived. The combined team of officers worked together to investigate the incident and attempted to capture the suspects. Members of the finger print technicians from the Automated Fingerprint and Identification Systems (AFIS) Unit responded to the scene in an effort to collect evidence that will help identify the suspects. Suspects are at large at this time.

SeaTac Police Explorers – Yakima Apple Cup Challenge

Four SeaTac Police Explorers competed in the Apple Cup Challenge in Yakima over Memorial Weekend. The event tested their training in areas like traffic stops, response to burglaries and high risk contacts. It also tested their physical fitness. Explorers Latasha Averett and Dolan won 3rd place in the Burglary Investigation. Explorer Yusuf won 1st place in the 300 meter sprint. Advisors were proud of the professional manner in which these Explorers represented the City of SeaTac throughout this event.
