




# South 200th Link Extension

## Construction Alert

## Overnight closure of South 182nd Street access at Sea-Tac Int'l Airport

On **Tuesday, July 8** between the hours of **12:30 a.m. and 5:00 a.m.**, Sound Transit's contractor, PCL Civil Constructors, will temporarily close the access to and from Sea-Tac Airport at the intersection of South 182nd Street and International Blvd. Entering traffic will be redirected to South 170<sup>th</sup> Street and International Blvd. Exiting traffic will be redirected to the off-ramp at South 170<sup>th</sup> Street.

This closure is need to move a large crane across the roadway as work continues to build the Link light rail extension to the future Angle Lake Station at South

200th Street.

### Airport entrance detour

All airport traffic entering the Airport from International Boulevard will be detoured to South 170th Street and follow existing signs to the Airport terminal and parking. A detour for Overheight Parking will be in place directing Airport passengers through the Departures curbside to the south parking entrance.

### Airport exit detour

All traffic exiting the Airport to International Blvd. will be detoured to the northbound lanes of the Northern Airport Expressway and off at the South 170<sup>th</sup> Street ramp.
