Award beneficiaries are recognized for strong internal recycling programs and their exceptional commitment to reducing the amount of waste their company sends to the landfill. Honor roll businesses have made the list for five years or more.

Police Staff Transitions

Sergeant Marcus Williams, who had several tours of duty in the City, was promoted to captain and transferred to Metro Transit Police on July 1. His well-qualified replacement is Sergeant Troy Olmsted, a veteran patrol sergeant who comes to us from the KCSO (King County Sheriffs Office) Internal Investigations Unit. Sergeant Williams is the second sergeant to be promoted to the rank of captain in the last year.

Crime Prevention Officer, Rich Rowe has accepted a patrol position in the City of Woodinville. His transfer will be effective as soon as we can identify and transition his replacement. All of us, including Officer Rowe, are sad that he's leaving.

Gang Violence at Angle Lake

On Saturday July 12 at about 7:00 PM, there was a large fight at Angle Lake Park, that included known members of at least two local gangs. One 18-year-old male was stabbed and is expected to survive. SeaTac Police responded quickly, assisted by members of the Burien Police and Sound Transit Police. There has been very little cooperation from witnesses and involved parties. A suspect has not yet been identified. To date, there have been no reports of further violence at the park. SeaTac Officers are monitoring the crowds and conditions in order to prevent further violence.

McMicken Community Meeting

On July 15, 33 Members of the McMicken Heights community attended a meeting hosted by SeaTac Police. The purpose of the meeting was to provide information and discuss neighborhood concerns about the suspicious death of long-time resident Robert Benson. Sergeant John McSwain and lead Detective Scott Tompkins, from the KCSO Major Crimes Unit attended to provide as much specific information as the investigation would allow. They answered specific questions and posed a few of their own, resulting in true dialogue that was well received by everyone. Although there can be many valuable results from a meeting such as this, the true benefit comes when fear is replaced with information and empowerment to watch out for each other, to watch for suspicious activity and to report it to 9-1-1 as soon as possible.
