"Walk & Talk" Tour of Angle Lake Station Area Hosted by Feet First

The public is invited to attend the Angle Lake Station Walk & Talk on Saturday, October 11, from 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM. The walk will begin at Angle Lake Park with opening remarks from SeaTac Mayor Mia Gregerson. Learn how Sound Transit is working to make the Angle Lake Station more accessible for people of all ages and abilities, and receive an update on the City's efforts to create a community supported plan to guide future development in the area.

The walking tour is sponsored by the non-profit Feet First and is a FREE interactive event. The Walk & Talk will include stops at locations near the future Angle Lake Station including Madrona Elementary and future development sites. Sound Transit, City staff and other speakers will provide information on the community's vision for creating a more walkable and transit oriented neighborhood, and the improvements Sound Transit is planning for the area.



Public Meeting about Comprehensive Plan Update

What does SeaTac's future look like? City staff is looking forward to the year 2035, and we would like to hear your thoughts.

Why 2035? We are in the process of updating the Comprehensive Plan, which was last updated in 2004. The updated Plan will look at how we should grow and improve, addressing the needs of current City residents and businesses, and new population and employment over the next 20 years: 2015 - 2035.

What is the Comprehensive Plan? The Comprehensive Plan is the City's "roadmap to the future." It covers all aspects of city development from transportation and land use to housing and parks/recreation, and all points in between.

The Planning Division and the Public Works Department are hosting a public meeting to show you

where we are on updating the Plan, and to hear your thoughts about how we move forward together.

Temporary closure of 28th Avenue S. in SeaTac

All lanes of 28th Avenue S. between S. 188th Street and S. 190th Street (across from the Hampton Inn & Suites) will continue to be closed to through traffic until Friday, October 10. Local access to businesses on 28th Avenue S., in the closure area will be maintained.

Sound Transit's contractor, PCL Civil Constructors and KLB Construction will be repairing a damaged storm sewer line in the area. Local access will be maintained to the Hampton Inn & Suites, Wally Park and Alaska Airlines Flight Operations Center. A posted detour will be in place to get around the work zone. Joint Community Meeting with Des Moines Police Department

On September 19, SeaTac and Des Moines Police hosted a joint community meeting to discuss ongoing concerns about crime in the area of S. 216th Street & International Boulevard. Goals for the meeting included hearing the concerns of the residents, explaining police efforts to date, encourage calls to 9-1-1 when crime is being committed and generally demonstrating joint commitment to addressing the problems. A group of 26 residents from both sides of the border attended to discuss the issues. The group of 26 was engaged, interested and ready to hold the police accountable for doing their part to address the issues.

New Neighborhood Crime Watch Meeting

Thirteen residents living in the area of S. 190th Street & 37th Avenue S. attended a meeting on October 1, to establish a new Neighborhood Crime Watch in that neighborhood. Led by Crime Prevention Deputy Cyndi Osborne, the participants discussed basic crime prevention techniques and theories.
